**DENTON COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY ANNOUNCES SERVICE  
CHANGES EFFECTIVE AUGUST 25, 2014**

**Lewisville, TX (July 30, 2014)** - The Denton County Transportation Authority (DCTA) will implement service changes on Monday, August 25, 2014. The changes will be available prior to schedule implementation online at [www.RideDCTA.net](http://www.RideDCTA.net) and in the August 2014 GO Guide. New schedule changes will allow DCTA to better accommodate passengers and improve service connectivity.

Below are key DCTA service changes:

**System Wide**

Minor schedule modifications were made to improve connections for passengers requiring transfers between multiple DCTA services and the Dallas Area Rapid Transit (DART) Green Line.

**UNT Shuttle**

The Colorado Express will be extended to the MedPark Station, which will provide additional connections between the University of North Texas (UNT) Denton campus and A-train. In addition, UNT students, faculty, staff and the general public can park at the MedPark Station and now have direct access to the UNT campus using the Colorado Express.

The Campus Cruiser service has been modified to improve frequency.

**NCTC Shuttle**

NCTC Shuttle service will be expanded to provide a north and south route to the Euline Brock Downtown Denton Transit Center (DDTC), MedPark and Highland Village/Lewisville Lake Stations, NCTC's Corinth and Flower Mound facilities and Lewisville. Both routes will connect at the Highland Village/Lewisville Lake Station so passengers can travel between Denton, Lewisville, and NCTC in Corinth and Flower Mound with just one transfer. When NCTC classes are in session, the NCTC shuttle will operate from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.
