9:00 a.m.

Explore the Courthouse-on-the-Square Museum

Local museum housing exhibits related to Denton County history and western heritage, including an entire area for kiddos. Admission is free and guided tours are available upon request.

Visit the Discover Denton Welcome Center

The Discover Denton Welcome Center is there to help equip visitors with information about events and attractions. Dentoning Experts are available to answer questions and you can find Denton-themed souvenirs for purchase.

Time for lunch

Craving Asian cuisine? Needing southern comfort food? Would a burger hit the spot? There are several spots to grab a bite, including Thai Square (209 W. Hickory), Cartwright's (111 N. Elm) and LSA Burger (113 W Hickory).

1:30 p.m.

Find your new bedtime story at Recycled Books

This multi-story book store contains a labyrinth of used books, records, CDs and, yes, VHS tapes. Make sure to visit the kids' section and take some shots of your kiddos going onto Platform 9 3/4ths.

2:30 p.m.

Work off the energy at Summit Climbing Gym

Stretch out those muscles with an afternoon at Summit Climbing Gym (220 W Oak). Bonus: this indoor rock climbing mecca has special rates for kids (\$12 for kids 13 and under, which includes gear rental).

3:30 p.m.

Visit Beth Marie's Old Fashioned Ice Cream Parlor

The smell of fresh waffle cones lead you to this unique ice cream shop with the feel of a historic ice cream and soda fountain parlor. The delicious ice cream is made in house with a machine that was built in 1927.

4:00 p.m.

Step back in time at the Firefighters Museum

Learn about Denton's amazing history of tragedy, triumph and true heroes at the Denton Firefighters Museum — a collection containing pieces spanning from 1800 to modern day. Make sure to take a look at the 9/11 Memorial Bell Tower out front of the museum!
